MONTHLY UPDATE – BARANGAROO STATION

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services start in 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms under Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland CPB Ghella Joint Venture (JHCPBG) has been awarded the \$2.81 billion contract to build the twin railway tunnels from Chatswood to Sydenham and excavate six new Sydney Metro stations.

Upcoming work – Barangaroo Station site

The Barangaroo Station site will close at **6pm on Friday 21 December 2018 and reopen at 7am on Monday 7 January 2019**. There is no planned work at the site during the shutdown period, other than some minor day time activities inside the acoustic shed on Hickson Road and regular maintenance inspections.

The table below provides more information about construction hours and activities planned from Monday 7 January 2019, weather and site conditions permitting (see map overleaf).

Standard working hours

Standard working hours are Monday to Friday, 7am–6pm and Saturday, 8am–1pm. Some low-noise generating activities such as ground support work will continue until 10pm Monday to Friday.


What to expect

- There will be intermittent periods of noisy work. If any high-impact noise activities such as saw cutting and hammering are required at night, they will be carried out as early as possible and will cease before midnight.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum.
- Temporary lighting may be used to ensure a safe work site and will be directed away from properties.
- Increased light vehicle and truck movements.
- Equipment used includes drills, vacuum excavation trucks, mobile cranes, elevated work platforms, concrete saws and chainsaws, excavators, rock hammers and compactors.
- There will be temporary single lane closures during standard construction hours while utility work is undertaken on High Street. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- Access to the High Steps, Nawi Cove and Barangaroo Reserve will be maintained at all times.
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times.
- Permanent restoration of roads and footpaths affected by the works will be undertaken at the end of the project.
